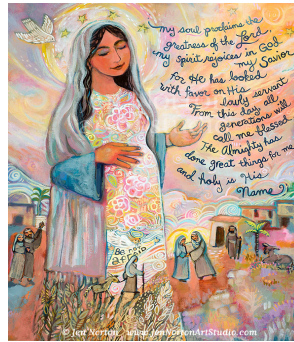

Key Knowledge	
Prophets and prophetesses communicate God's message inspired by the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist is born to be a prophet.	Christians believe that the person Isaiah spoke of was Jesus. In Isaiah's word, Christians recognise Jesus as a light in the darkness and Immanuel, 'God-with-us'.
Zechariah had special message about John's future: 'and you, child, will be called a prophet of the most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for Him.' Luke 1:76	Advent is the season when Christians prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas.
The Advent wreath is a symbol of the coming of the light.	The Christmas story be celebrated in song, such as in carol services, our nativity performance or our Advent Service.
Mary is the mother of God and our mother who is trusted with all our prayers.	Mary's prayer, the Magnificat, gives thanks to God and prays for his just world to come.
